## From the Principal -

### HOW DO THE BEST STUDENTS STUDY?

DEAR PARENT:

Studying is a very personal act. We all have our own style. Some can work while a stereo is booming nearby; others need everyone at home cooperating to keep the noise level down to a soft whisper. Some can work at the kitchen table not bothered by the mixing and chopping of dinner being made, while others need a quiet, private spot away from it all.

Yes, there are many ways to study. But are they all effective? Our top students tell us that some ways are better than others. In fact, research across the country has shown that most of our highest achieving students have many of the same study habits.

You might suggest some of these techniques if your teenager is having trouble making the best use of his or her study time at home.

The Best Students...

\*Are Predictable. If schoolwork is done at home the same time every day, it becomes a firm habit and is much less apt to be neglected or forgotten.

\*Set Mini Goals. Some teens delay or never get started because they are overwhelmed by what appears to be more work than they can handle. But if you break down one large project, assignment or block of study time into several smaller pieces and think of tackling them one at a time, the work suddenly seems more doable.

This is especially true if your son or daughter schedules a short break or small reward after reaching each mini goal.

\*Skim-Read-Review. This approach gives your teen the best chance to get the most out of a read-study assignment. First skim or survey the reading section concentrating on any introduction there might be, bold-faced headings, charts, pictures and captions. This will uncover most of the main ideas.

Then go back and carefully read the chapter or section. A helpful trick is to turn each subheading into a question – and then read to find the answer.

\*Outline or Take Notes. Your teen won't remember every main idea, so it's important to get them down on paper. The easiest way is to use the subheadings of a chapter as the main points of an outline. Then under each point, list the key bits of information.

\*Think Like a Teacher. This is the "Review" step in the skim-read-review approach described above. Suggest that your teen go through the chapter again, but with this thought in mind: "If you were a teacher, what questions about the section would you ask on a test?" This should make the final reading clearer and more interesting.

**GENERAL ANNOUNCEMENTS**

**Scheduling for 2005-06:** Scheduling for next year is currently underway. Students have been given the Student Registration Form and a copy of the Program of Studies, containing graduation requirements and course descriptions. Students and parents should review these items carefully and choose their courses wisely. Students will meet individually with their counselor to review their course selections and turn in their registration form. Prior to the individual conference with their counselor, students are required to secure their teacher recommendations and parent signature. Students who do not receive a teacher recommendation for the course they want to take may get a waiver form from their counselor for their parent to sign. The completed course registration form will be collected as follows:

11<sup>th</sup> Grade - Week of Feb. 6

10<sup>th</sup> Grade - Week of Feb. 13

9<sup>th</sup> Grade - Week of Feb. 21

**Schedule Changes:** Planning a schedule for the next school year is a difficult task and situations may occur requiring a change in that schedule. These schedule changes, however, have a serious effect on class size, teacher assignments and the overall master schedule, and therefore, will be approved sparingly. The student and parent are urged not to plan a program with the idea that it can be changed.

**As of May 1, 2006, no changes will occur unless:**

1. There is a technical error in the scheduling process.
2. If it becomes clear that the student is academically misplaced as determined by the classroom teacher.
3. There is a scheduling conflict, (conflicts occur when courses that the student requests meet at the same time).

**Summer School:** Any student who failed a core class (English, Social Studies, Science or Math) in the first semester should plan to attend the first semester of summer school. Information on summer school will be available on the district web site in early May.

**State Mandated Testing:** The Ohio Graduation Test will be administered during the week of March 13, 2006.

**Post Secondary Enrollment Options:** PSEOP allows high school students to take college classes while still in high school, as long as the participating college or university admits them. All students who plan to participate in PSEOP for the 2006-07 school year, must attend a required meeting with their parents, on Thursday, March 9 at 7:00 p.m. This meeting is required even if you currently participate in this program or have attended past meetings.

**Honor/Merit Roll:** Students who excel academically will be recognized by placement on the following: High Honor Roll – 4.00 and above, Honor Roll – 3.5 to 3.99, and Merit Roll – 3.0 to 3.49. Any grade of D or lower will disqualify a student from either the Honor or Merit Roll. During the second and fourth quarters exam grades of D or lower eliminates a student from either the Honor or Merit Roll.

**Fines:** Report cards are not issued if the student owes any type of fine. This includes book fines, library fines and athletic fines. Progress reports, however are always mailed home.

*INFORMATION FOR SENIORS*

*Senior Parents: Is the thought of your son or daughter graduating and going off to college or leaving home causing you anxiety? Dr. Ken DeLuca will address this issue at a special presentation for senior parents on Thursday, March 16 at 7:00 PM.*

*Senioritis: Seniors need to remember to keep up their academic performance. College admission committees reserve the right to withdraw an offer of admission if the student's performance falls below the acceptable level.*

**Graduation Requirements:** It is the students' responsibility to see that requirements for graduation are met. Specific requirements are listed in the Program of Studies. Seniors who failed a first semester class should meet with their counselor as soon as possible to review their course and credit requirements for graduation.

**Night School:** Seniors needing night school can obtain registration forms from their counselor.

**Academic Awards:** To be eligible to receive honors and awards such as Summa Cum Laude, the Award of Merit, the Honors Diploma and the President's Award or scholarships provided by various school or community groups, a student must have completed a minimum of seven semesters in grades nine through twelve. GPA for these awards will be based on the 7<sup>th</sup> semester GPA.

**FAFSA – Free Application for Student Aid:** All seniors attending a two or four year college should complete the FAFSA. Forms are available in the guidance office or students can file online. By completing this form, you supply the information needed to possibly qualify for a Pell Grant or Stafford Loan. This form should be filed as soon as possible as resources are limited. We recommend filing by February 15. It is important to fill out the form completely, legibly and honestly. Everyone should file the FAFSA even if you think you will not qualify; you never know when your circumstances will change.

**Cleveland Scholarship:** The Cleveland Scholarship representative is here on Wednesdays to assist students and parents with the financial aid process. An appointment can be made by contacting the guidance office at 835-6375.

**Scholarship Information:** Scholarship information is posted on our web site. Students should read the criteria for each scholarship carefully and adhere to the deadlines. Transcript requests for scholarship applications require 15 school days to process. Local scholarships will be available beginning March 10, with an application deadline of April 10.

### INFORMATION FOR JUNIORS

**JUNIOR PARENT COLLEGE NIGHT:** Junior Parent College Night will be held on Thursday, March 2 at 7:00 p.m. Representatives from several colleges will explain the application process. The College Planning Guide will be distributed. Juniors and their parents are invited to attend.

*COLLEGE PLANNING: Now is the time to begin researching colleges. Reference books listing all of the colleges are available in the guidance office, local library, and area bookstores. You can also search online; links to various sites are available on the WHS Guidance Department web page. All colleges encourage campus visits; many have special fall or spring programs for visiting high school students. In addition, many colleges offer summer academic and athletic programs. Contact the admissions office at the school of your choice for further information. Remember, as you consider various colleges, there is no best college. There are only "right" colleges, often several of them. Your task is to discover and choose a college that is "right" for you. No single college will be perfect in every respect; be prepared to compromise.*

### TESTING INFORMATION

**PSAT:** In January, your student received his/her results from the October administration of the PSAT. If you have not yet seen the results, ask your student to share those with you. The score report provides the question number, the student's answer and the correct answer. The test booklet is returned to your student at the same time as the results. Taking time to carefully review the score report can be beneficial in preparing for the SAT.

**ACT/SAT Tests:** Students planning to attend a four-year college or university need to take the SAT and/or ACT exam. We recommend taking these exams in the spring of the junior year. The SAT exam now has three sections, Critical Reading, Mathematics and Writing. More information on this test can be found at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com). The ACT exam has four sections, English, Reading, Mathematics and Science. The ACT also has an optional writing section. Students taking only the ACT should take the writing section at least once. More information on the ACT can be found on their web site at [www.act.org](http://www.act.org). Both testing companies prefer online registration, but paper registration materials are available in the guidance office.

**ACT/SAT PREP:** Should a student take a test prep course or not? That is often a difficult question. The best preparation for college entrance examinations is enrolling in and excelling in a rigorous college preparatory curriculum. However, if a student is motivated and willing to put in the time a test prep course demands, test preparation can be helpful. Other less costly options are available and these include:

1. The ACT has practice tests on its web site at [www.act.org](http://www.act.org).
2. The College Board has test prep on its web site at [www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com).
3. The WHS library has Princeton Review Books and ACT practice disks for student use.
4. Students can purchase a computer program for SAT/ACT review.
5. Area bookstores have a number of books on the topic.

### INFORMATION FOR SOPHOMORES

**PLAN (Pre-ACT) TEST INTERPRETATION NIGHT:** Parents and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students who took the PLAN Test in November are invited to attend a test interpretation evening sponsored by the guidance department on Thursday, February 16 at 7:00 p.m. in the Café. Students will receive their results and a representative from the ACT office in Chicago will give a presentation on how to interpret the results.

**PSAT:** In January, your student received his/her results from the October administration of the PSAT. If you have not yet seen the results, ask your student to share those with you. The score report provides the question number, the student's answer and the correct answer. The test booklet is returned to your student at the same time as the results. Taking time to carefully review the score report can be beneficial in preparing for the SAT.

## INFORMATION FOR FRESHMAN

**GRADING SYSTEM:** We are on a semester grading system with credit being awarded at the end of each semester. Semester grades for the first semester include the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter grade (40%), the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter grade (40%) and the final exam (20%). The second semester grades are figured using the same format. The cumulative GPA is based on the semester grades. Progress reports and report cards are issued each grading period.

**CUMULATIVE GPA:** Freshman now have a cumulative GPA, which appears, in the cumulative GPA box on the report card. The cumulative GPA is based on the semester grades. It also includes any previous semester grades in course work taken in summer school or course work taken in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade for high school credit. The cumulative GPA is the important one. It is the GPA that appears on the high school transcript and it is the one that colleges consider during their admission process.

**CREDITS:** Credit for passed courses is awarded at the end of the first semester. It can be found on the report card in the Credit Earned Lifetime box. It includes credits earned during the first semester of this year, as well as any semester credits previously earned. It is important for students and parents to review this box on the report card and monitor the credits earned because this determines promotion to the next grade level. To promote to the 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will need to have earned 6 credits.

### INFORMATION REGARDING NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY AT WESTLAKE HIGH SCHOOL

National Honor Society was created to recognize students who demonstrate clear and consistent evidence of outstanding service, leadership, character, and scholarship throughout all their years of high school. The following information refers specifically to the Westlake Chapter of NHS.

1. Induction is held in the spring for juniors, and in the fall for seniors.
2. Students with a 3.5 GPA at the end of the 5<sup>th</sup> semester of high school will receive a letter informing them that they are eligible to submit information to the Faculty Selection Committee.
3. A list of these students is given to the faculty. The faculty assigns a point value of 1-4 to each student indicating to what level they observe the student actively demonstrating positive leadership and character traits. The student names are then removed and this information is given to the faculty selection committee.
4. The faculty selection committee convenes to consider the information provided by each student regarding his/her service and leadership activities. The information sheets are anonymous. The committee provides the advisor with a list of students (by number only) to whom they are offering an invitation to join. The advisor then contacts each student. The advisor is not a member of the selection committee and has no vote.

#### *PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING*

1. Membership is only available to students who are actively involved in their school, church, and/or community. Being involved does not guarantee an invitation to join. It is the prerequisite.
2. The national guidelines emphasize that all four areas are to be fulfilled. The "leadership" component is often the most difficult. Westlake High School selection committees require that leadership must be demonstrated through a strong faculty vote along with documented leadership positions held throughout high school. The committee looks at the number of hours invested in each activity. Invitations to join are offered to those students whom they feel have gone above and beyond average participation.
3. To receive a strong leadership vote from the faculty, it is encouraged that each student participate actively in class every day, demonstrate good conflict resolution skills, and serve as a role model to others.
4. Schools differ widely in their approach to NHS. Some require only that a certain GPA be achieved. Inclusion is then automatic. **This letter is to inform you that Westlake requires documented evidence of service and leadership activities throughout the first three years of high school.** Students meeting the grade point criteria will receive all information needed early in the second semester of their junior year.

#### **National Honor Society Selection Process Westlake High School Chapter**

The Westlake Chapter of the National Honor Society inducts new members in the spring and fall of each year. The basic requirement for an invitation to apply for consideration of participation in the privilege of membership is a cumulative 3.50 grade point average after five semesters. Scholastically eligible students must also demonstrate the qualities of character, leadership and service.

The first step in the application process is the potential candidate's attendance at a mandatory informational meeting. Application packets will be distributed at this time, and must be submitted to the appointed advisor's mailbox at the announced time in order to be considered. The general faculty will then evaluate only those candidates with whom they are familiar in terms of leadership and character. Using the scores from the faculty ratings and the candidate's submitted leadership and service forms, the Faculty Council will evaluate and determine the membership eligibility of each applicant. The names of applicants shall remain anonymous. As determined by the Faculty Council, students *showing clear and consistent evidence of exemplary performance* in each of the areas of scholarship, leadership, service and character shall be selected for induction.

The following guidelines will give further help in the definition of leadership, service, and character:

#### **Leadership**

##### ***The student who exercises leadership:***

- Is resourceful in proposing new problems, applying principles, and making suggestions
- Demonstrates initiative in promoting school activities
- Exercises influence on peers in upholding school ideals
- Contributes ideas that improve the civic life of the school
- Is able to delegate responsibilities

- Exemplifies positive attitudes
- Inspires positive behavior in others
- Demonstrates academic initiative
- Successfully holds school offices or positions of responsibility, conducting business effectively and efficiently, and without prodding, demonstrates reliability and dependability
- Is a forerunner in the classroom, at work, and in school or community activities
- Is thoroughly dependable in any responsibility accepted.

#### Service

##### *The student who serves:*

- Is willing to uphold scholarship and maintain a loyal school attitude
- Participates in some outside activity: Girls Scouts; Boy Scouts; church groups; volunteer service for the aged, poor, or disadvantaged; family duties
- Volunteers dependable and well-organized assistance, is gladly available, and is willing to sacrifice to offer assistance
- Works well with others and is willing to take on difficult or inconspicuous responsibilities
- Cheerfully and enthusiastically renders any requested service to the school
- Is willing to represent the class or school in inter-class and inter-scholastic competition
- Does committee and staff work without complaint
- Shows courtesy by assisting visitors, teachers, and students.

#### Character

##### *The student of character:*

- Takes criticism willingly and accepts recommendations graciously
- Consistently exemplifies desirable qualities of behavior (cheerfulness, friendliness, poise, stability)
- Upholds principles of morality and ethics
- Cooperates by complying with school regulations concerning property, programs, office, halls, etc.
- Demonstrates the highest standards of honesty and reliability
- Shows courtesy, concern, and respect for others
- Observes instructions and rules, punctuality, and faithfulness both inside and outside the classroom
- Has powers of concentration and sustained attention as shown by perseverance and application to studies
- Manifests truthfulness in acknowledging obedience to rules, avoiding cheating in written work, and showing unwillingness to profit by the mistakes of others
- Actively helps rid the school of bad influences or environment.

In its consideration of the Leadership and Service activities the Faculty Council will be considering involvement beyond mere membership. As such, the Faculty Council will likely assess both the variety and qualitative as well as the quantitative values of each applicant's leadership and service activities.

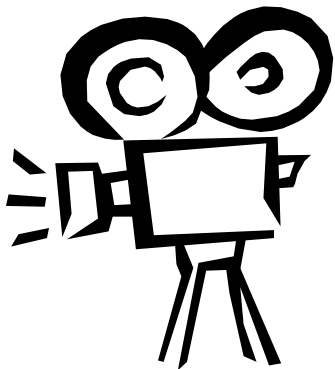

**National City Cleveland Home & Garden Show**  
**9<sup>th</sup> Annual Student Model Home Design Contest**

**Westlake** - Westlake High School has once again been selected as the site for the judging and awards presentation portion of the National City Cleveland Home and Garden Show 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Student Model Home Design Contest. The judging will take place on Friday evening (1-20-06) at approximately 5:30 p.m. in the high school library. The Advanced Technical Drawing/Design students of Westlake High School will vie for an unprecedented 6th straight title.

The speech and award presentations will be Saturday morning (1-21-06) starting at 10:00 a.m., also held in the library. Scheduled to appear will be Mike Halloran and/or Rob Attewell, Show Managers of the National City Cleveland Home & Garden Show, and possibly one or two other industry sponsors as well. The presentations will conclude at approximately 11:00-11:30 a.m.

The top ten winning models and drawings will be displayed at the 2006 National City Cleveland Home and Garden Show, February 4-12 at the I-X Center. The top winner will be awarded a \$1000 scholarship to further his/her education in a related technical field. Second place will be a \$300 scholarship. Cash awards will be given to the remaining 8 places. Third place will be \$100 cash, fourth place \$75, and fifth place through tenth

place \$50 each. Additional cash prizes will be awarded for 3 specialty categories; “Best Presentation” (\$400), “Best Model” (\$150), & “Best CAD/3D Drawings” (\$100).

Sponsored by the Northern Ohio Concrete Homes Association, Schill Architecture, and the National City Cleveland Home & Garden Show, these future architects, designers, contractors, and artisans were challenged to design homes that are functional, marketable, innovative, energy-efficient, and addressed the wants and needs of prospective homebuyers.

This year’s student contest theme is “Holland in Bloom - A Dutch Masterpiece”. Students were to design a home for a family of 4 transferring from Holland to the Cleveland area. The family wishes to build a new home located on a waterway with architecture significant to that of their Holland homeland. The student contest theme reflects the same theme of the Home and Garden Show this year. The students were instructed to design the home featuring an above grade concrete home (ICF) system, which incorporates proper and creative use of other building elements, such as insulation and window orientation, to reduce energy costs.

Concrete home design offers homeowners increased energy efficiency, lower maintenance and substantial cost savings. Because of their unique construction properties, concrete homes can be designed with virtually any type of exterior and interior. Concrete is one of the most fire resistant construction materials and the strength and durability of concrete walls offer unmatched resistance to the devastation of major storms.

Using their knowledge of architectural design and concrete construction, student entries will include floor plan drawings and scaled model homes. They will be judged in 45 separate categories, including design, planning and innovations, energy-conserving features, drawing presentation, model presentation, and exterior design. Schools entered this year include Avon Lake High School, Cuyahoga Valley Career Center, Holy Name High School, Maplewood Career Center, Wadsworth High School, and host Westlake High School. A panel of building industry professionals from across the area will evaluate the student designs.

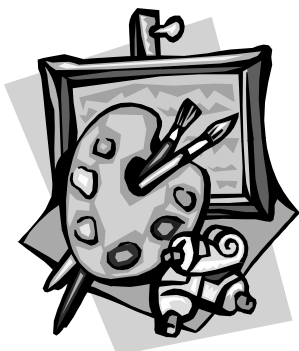

## ***HOW TO REGISTER***

Voters must be registered in Cuyahoga County in order to vote in any election. In order to vote in Cuyahoga County, you must meet the following requirements:

- You must be a United States Citizen;
- You must be at least 18 years old on the day of the General Election;
- You must be a resident of Cuyahoga County for at least 30 days;
- You must register to vote at least 30 days before an election to be eligible to vote.
- 17-year-old residents can register and vote in a Primary Election if they will be 18 on or before the General Election. 17-year-olds can vote for candidates only.

- Call the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections at 216-443-3298 for a Voter Registration Card to be mailed to you. Complete it and mail it back.

## ***HOW TO VOTE***

**You are entitled to vote by absentee ballot if:**

- You will be absent from Cuyahoga County on Election Day.
- You are 62 years of age or older.
- You are a firefighter, peace officer or provider of emergency medical services.
- You or a family member will be hospitalized on Election Day.
- You have a physical illness or a disability.
- You cannot vote on Election Day because of religious beliefs.
- You will be in jail for a misdemeanor or awaiting trial.
- You are an election official or Board of Elections employee.
- You are on active duty in the state with an organized militia.

### **You may request an absentee ballot from the Board of Elections by:**

  - Your name and address where you are registered to vote.
  - Reason for requesting an absentee ballot.
  - The election for which you are requesting a ballot.
  - The mailing address where you want your ballot sent.

- Your signature as it appears on your voter registration card.
- Date of birth
- For a Primary Election, indicate your choice of Democratic, Republican, or an Issues Only ballot

**Your completed absentee ballot must be returned to the Board of Elections before 7:30 PM on Election Day to be counted.**

You may return your voted absentee ballot by:

- Mailing it to the Board of Elections using the envelope provided.
- You or a relative may hand-deliver it to the Board of Elections.
